#### 1. Management Performance and Financial Conditions

#### (1) Management Results

Under the three-year medium-term management plan "BUILDING THE FUTURE 2025," which concludes in the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, the Company is committed to sustainable growth and enhancement of corporate value through four management strategies: [1]Delivering innovative solutions for customer needs; [2]Enhancing value chain business; [3]Expanding business in the Americas; and [4]Strengthening human capital and corporate capabilities.

During the 1H of the fiscal year under review (April 1, 2024 to September 30, 2024), demand for hydraulic excavators generally declined. In particular, Western Europe and North America have been affected by high interest rates and other factors.

Mining demand remained challenging for small mining hydraulic excavators for Asia. On the other hand, ultra-large machinery remained relatively firm.

Under these circumstances, the mining business and the value chain business, on which we have been focusing our efforts, performed well. In the Americas business, revenue from independent development decreased from the same period of the previous year, when it grew significantly, due to a lull in inventory buildup by dealers. On the other hand, the dealers' retail sales share to end customers steadily increased as expected.

As a result of these factors, revenue decreased slightly to ¥665,737 million (a decrease of 0.0% year on year).

As for consolidated income items, despite continued efforts to reduce costs and raise selling prices, as well as the impact of the yen's depreciation, the decrease in sales volume and increases in personnel and R&D expenses had a negative impact. As a result, adjusted operating income decreased to \(\frac{\frac{\text{71}}}{314}\) million (a decrease of 13.5% year on year). Net income attributable to owners of the parent was \(\frac{\frac{\text{31}}}{31747}\) million (a decrease of 44.8% year on year), due to an increase in one-off financial expenses, mainly due to foreign exchange losses resulting from the appreciation of the yen at the end of the term.

As a note, from the 4Q of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024, the non-core businesses in the Specialized Parts & Service business segment are classified as discontinued operations in line with IFRS accounting standards. As a result, for the 1H of the current and previous fiscal years, revenue, adjusted operating income, operating income, and income before income taxes are presented in amounts for continuing operations excluding discontinued operations, while net income and net income attributable to owners of the parent are presented as the sum of continuing operations and discontinued operations.

Business results by segment are described below.

#### [1] Construction Machinery Business

During the 1H of the fiscal year under review, revenue was \\$605,829 million (an increase of 0.6% year on year) and adjusted operating income was \\$64,312 million (a decrease of 13.5% year on year), respectively.

In both the construction and mining businesses, the value chain business centered on parts and services performed well, but adjusted operating income declined, mainly due to the decrease in sales volume in the main markets such as North America, Europe, and Asia as well as higher personnel and R&D expenses.

#### [2] Specialized Parts & Service Business

This segment consists primarily of Bradken Pty Limited and its subsidiaries, which are engaged in the parts and services business in the after-sales of mining facilities and machinery, and H-E Parts International LLC and its subsidiaries, which provide service solutions.

During the 1H of the fiscal year under review, revenue was \(\frac{4}{4},474\) million (a decrease of 2.8% year on year). Adjusted operating income decreased to \(\frac{4}{7},002\) million (a decrease of 13.8% year on year), mainly due to the impact of decreased revenue and an increase in personnel expenses.

The above revenues of segments [1] and [2] are figures before intersegment adjustments.

#### (2) Outlook for the Fiscal Year Ending March 2025

Regarding demand for hydraulic excavators for the full year ending March 31, 2025, in North America, the pace of the Fed's interest rate cuts was slower than expected, and the market recovery that had been expected in the 2H of the year is now expected to be delayed until the following year or later. Meanwhile, in other regions as expected since the beginning of the fiscal year, demand is expected to decrease significantly from the previous year in Western Europe, which is affected by high interest rates, and in India, where the outlook is uncertain after elections. Demand in China is expected to remain at the same low level as the previous year. Taking these factors into consideration, we have revised our forecast for global demand for hydraulic excavators downward by 7 thousand units to approximately 199 thousand units (down 11% year on year) from our previous full-year forecast announced in July. Demand for mining machinery for the full year is expected to decline for small mining excavators for Asia, as we had previously forecast, because thermal coal prices have settled down and small and medium-sized miners are expected to be less willing to invest in mining machinery. As a result, we will maintain our previous forecast for demand for new machinery, but we expect that demand for overhauls and regular maintenance will continue to be strong due to high utilization rates.

Based on the above market conditions, we have revised down our consolidated earnings forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025 (April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025) from the previous forecast announced in July. In terms of profits, we have also revised our forecasts downwards due to a decrease in the sales volume in our main markets, as well as an expected increase in overhead costs, mainly personnel cost by enhancing human capital investment and R&D expenses for sustainable development. In terms of cash flow, we have made progress in reducing working capital, and based on the results of the 1H of the year, we expect to be able to generate a reasonable amount of cash in the 2H as well, so we plan to maintain our initial plan for shareholder returns for the year.

We will continue our efforts to reduce costs and raise selling prices, and through the growth of our focused businesses in the Americas, the mining business, and the value chain business, we aim to transform ourselves into a stable profit structure that is less susceptible to the demand for new machinery.

Regarding the exchange rate assumptions for the third quarter and beyond in this forecast, we are leaving the rate for the US dollar at \$141, but are changing it for the euro to \$155, the Chinese yuan to \$19.8, and the Australian dollar to \$96.

Through the realization of our unique mission, "Meet expectations from customers, co-create innovative products, services, solutions, and together, we continue to create new values", we will continue to earnestly strive to realize our corporate vision of "Ensure a prosperous land and society for the future. We contribute toward realizing a safe and sustainable society". We have also recently established a new concept, "LANDCROS" in July of this year, to reflect the Hitachi Construction Machinery Group's desire to deliver innovative solutions for every stakeholder. The entire Hitachi Construction Machinery Group will work to disseminate and promote this new concept and innovate our corporate culture.

#### (3) Analysis of Financial Condition

### [1] Status of Assets, Liabilities, and Net Assets

#### (Assets)

Current assets amounted to  $\frac{1003,559}{1000}$  million, a decrease of 6.9%, or  $\frac{1000}{1000}$  million, from the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to a decrease of  $\frac{1000}{1000}$  million in trade receivables and  $\frac{1000}{1000}$  million in inventories.

Non-current assets amounted to  $\frac{1}{4}$  748,985 million, a decrease of 1.1%, or  $\frac{1}{4}$  8,470 million, from the previous fiscal year-end. This was due mainly to a decrease of  $\frac{1}{4}$  4,604 million in property, plant and equipment and  $\frac{1}{4}$  2,401 million in trade receivables.

As a result, total assets decreased by 4.5%, or  $\frac{1}{2}$  82,461 million, from the previous fiscal year-end to  $\frac{1}{2}$  1,752,544 million.

#### (Liabilities)

Current liabilities amounted to  $\frac{1}{2}$  614,549 million, a decrease of 15.6%, or  $\frac{1}{2}$  113,199 million, from the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to a decrease of  $\frac{1}{2}$  57,235 million in bonds and borrowings and  $\frac{1}{2}$  46,654 million in trade and other payables.

Non-current liabilities amounted to \$ 321,649 million, an increase of 9.8%, or \$ 28,805 million, from the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to an increase of \$ 35,700 million in bonds and borrowings although there was a decrease of \$ 2,898 million in lease liabilities.

As a result, total liabilities decreased by 8.3%, or  $\frac{1}{8}$  84,394 million, from the previous fiscal year-end to  $\frac{1}{8}$  936,198 million.

#### (Equity)

Total equity increased by 0.2%, or  $\frac{1}{933}$  million, from the previous fiscal year-end to  $\frac{1}{933}$  816,346 million. This was mainly due to retained earnings.

#### [2] Analysis of the Status of Consolidated Cash Flows

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of semi-annual period totaled  $\frac{144,672}{144,672}$  million, an increase of  $\frac{1142}{142}$  million from the beginning of the fiscal year. Statement and factors relating to each cash flow category are as follows:

#### (Net cash provided by operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities for the semi-annual period based on  $\frac{1}{2}$  35,092 million in net income, and included  $\frac{1}{2}$  32,266 million in depreciation, a  $\frac{1}{2}$  61,296 million decrease in trade receivables and contract assets, while a  $\frac{1}{2}$  42,558 million decrease in trade payables and a  $\frac{1}{2}$  24,408 million income tax paid as cash outflow.

As a result, net cash provided by operating activities for the semi-annual period totaled to an inflow of  $\frac{1}{2}$  64,362 million, an increase inflow of  $\frac{1}{2}$  36,213 million year on year.

#### (Net cash (provided by) used in investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities for the semi-annual period amounted to \$ 23,313 million, a decrease of \$ 3,693 million year on year. This was mainly due to an outlay of \$ 16,981 million for capital expenditures.

As a result, free cash flows, the sum of net cash provided by operating activities and net cash used in investing activities, amounted to an inflow of \( \frac{1}{4} \) 41,049 million.

#### (Net cash provided by (used in) financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities for the semi-annual period amounted to \$ 36,399 million. While there was an increase of \$ 42,245 million in proceeds from long-term debt and bond, this was mainly due to \$ 43,007 payments on long-term debt and bond and a \$ 17,868 million dividends paid (including dividends paid to non-controlling interests)

As a result, cash for financing activities for the semi-annual period produced an increased outflow of \(\frac{1}{2}\) 23,518 million year on year.

(Segment Information)

#### 1) Overview of business segments

The operating segments of the Group are the components for which separate financial information is available and that are evaluated regularly by the chief operating decision maker in deciding how to allocate resources and in assessing performance. The reportable segments are determined based on the operating segment.

Taking into consideration the nature of products and services as well as categories, types of customers, and economic characteristics in a comprehensive manner, the company determines to classify two reportable segments as follows: The Construction Machinery Business Segment primarily intends to provide customers with a series of total life cycle solutions related to construction machinery such as the manufacture and sale of hydraulic excavators, ultra-large hydraulic excavators, and wheeled loaders, as well as the sale of parts related to these products. The Specialized Parts Service Business Segment primarily intends to provide services, production, and distribution parts that are not included in the Construction Machinery Business Segment.

Due to the reclassification of non-core business that was previously included in the Specialized Parts & Service business segment to discontinued operations, we only have presented amounts of continuing operations excluding amounts of discontinued operations.
